Helen Rowley from Van Wert, Ohio patented this bizarre piece of beauty history in 1875. She called it a "Mask for Medical Purposes" and claimed that it would "excite perspiration with a view to soften and clarify the skin." It is supposed to be worn during the hours of sleep and may be used to bleach the skin "for freckles or fugitive discolorations."

Dangerous cosmetic inventions were commonly peddled to the Victorian upper classes. Arsenic soap claimed to cure pimples and "bad blood." Makeup foundation made with lead was particularly popular for covering smallpox scars and poisoning the body.

Some of the claims made by Madam Rowley include:

"The mask is Soft and Flexible in form and can be easily applied and worn without discomfort or inconvenience." (Yes, that head strap looks so comfy to sleep in...if you're Hannibal Lecter)

"It has been analysed by Eminent Scientists and Chemical Experts and pronounced perfectly pure and harmless." (Harmless until your husband sees you wearing it!)

"It is recommended by Eminent Physicians and Scientific Men as a substitute for injurious cosmetics." (Can't get less injurious than chlorine!)

"It is durable, and does not dissolve or come asunder, but holds its original mask shape." (Asunder your chin(s)? ©)
